

SFI – education in Swedish for immigrants

SFI, education in Swedish for immigrants, is a basic education in the Swedish language for adults with a native language other than Swedish.

FACTS ABOUT SFI

- All immigrants older than 16, lacking basic knowledge of Swedish and registered in Piteå, are eligible for SFI. Citizens of EU/EEA or Switzerland need to be residents of Piteå and have right of residence.
- Those on parental leave or sick leave are also eligible for SFI.
- Those under the age of 20 are primarily referred to the language introduction course at the high school.
- SFI education is free of charge.
- SFI studies do not entitle you to get financial aid from CSN.
- You can combine your SFI studies with work placement, work or other studies

COURSES

- Sfi I for those with little or no previous education. Includes courses A, B, C and D.
- Sfi 2 for those with some education. Includes courses B, C and D.
- Sfi 3 for those with higher education. Includes courses C and D.

Daytime students have classes 15 hours a week, Monday through Friday. Classes are scheduled some mornings and some afternoons.

Those who are used to studying and have some knowledge of Swedish are eligible for distance studies with tutorials.
